What do I need to do when I travel in my country of residence?

As from January 1st 2016, your Interrail Global Pass is also valid for two trips in the country in which you reside/live, or you have citizenship for, provided that this country is an Interrail member country^{*}. This is the country that is printed on your ticket in the top right corner (see image below).

You can make **one outbound journey** to the border in order to start using your Global Pass and **one inbound journey** at the end of your travels. The following rules apply for these two trips:

- You may travel with more than one train, provided the trips are within the same day *and* in the direction of the border or airport.
- You must fill out on the Pass Cover the dates on which you will use the outbound* and inbound journey. If you do not travel in your country of residence, you do not have to fill in this part of the Travel Diary (see image 1.).
- You must ensure each outbound and inbound trip is are also registered in the Travel Diary section on your pass cover (See image 2.).

-Outbound Journey is your first trip in the direction of the border or airport resulting in you leaving the country in which you live or you are a citizen of.

-Inbound Journey is the journey in the direction of your final destination in the country where you live or are a citizen of, from the border or an airport. This should be the final trip of your journey.
